This document was compiled by the Long Beach Unified School District (LBUSD) in response to multiple requests for a community resource guide to help facilitate the process. Along with descriptions of agency services, the reader will find information about a variety of public and private benefits programs and enrollment sites throughout the Greater Long Beach area. Assisting families with benefits enrollment is critical to ensuring successful access to resources, because many agencies require participation in these programs.

There are two ways to look for services in this guide: the *Table of Contents* in the front and the *EZ Reference Guide* in the back. The Table of Contents groups agencies by category: childcare, mentoring, mental health and so forth. Because many agencies provide multiple types of services, they may appear in several categories in this section. However, the description of each agency's services is usually located in only one place in the document. It can be found by looking for page numbers in either the front or back of the book. The *EZ Reference Guide*, located in the back, is an alphabetical index of agencies with page and phone numbers.

When we know about available resources and the benefits required to access programs, we can successfully link people to services. By grouping agencies in categories, we can see what we have and where there are gaps in services. We can also use the information in this guide to become acquainted with providers we don't already know, and engage them in the dialogue necessary to build bridges and fill in gaps.

Putting this resource guide together and keeping it updated is a community effort. Special thanks to those who patiently and enthusiastically provided the information contained herein.

CRISIS INTERVENTION

WHAT IS IMMINENT DANGER?

Welfare and Institutions Codes (WIC) 5150 for adults and 5585 for minors state that suspected mentally disordered persons who pose a danger to themselves or others, or are gravely disabled, may be taken into custody and placed in a county-approved psychiatric facility for 72 hours of evaluation and treatment.

PSYCHIATRIC EMERGENCIES IN SCHOOL

LA County Department of Mental Health (DMH) psychiatric mobile response teams (PMRT) are available for imminent danger evaluation at all LBUSD schools. Private PMRT services provided by College and Del Amo hospitals are not authorized to work in LBUSD.

However, schools have choices when faced with a potentially dangerous psychiatric situation. They can contact the designated DMH PMRT or their local law enforcement agency. Long Beach and Signal Hill schools have the option of calling the Mental Evaluation Team (MET), Long Beach Police Department's PMRT. All schools can contact the Long Beach Child and Adolescent Program for consultation and support.

An important factor in deciding which PMRT to use is their proposed response time. Depending on the number of available emergency-responders and the number of crises they are dealing with at one time, this may vary.

When calling a PMRT, inquire how long it will take them to get to the location of the youth. If the stated response time is not acceptable, call another agency, and then decide which one may accommodate the needs of the situation more rapidly.

However, if the decision is made to transport, notify the agency in advance and inform them of the type of insurance coverage held by the student. Private insurance companies may require prior authorization and/or charge full cost for services. FEE: Medi-Cal, Healthy Families, sliding scale.
